

From Reverend Kathy's Desk

The season of Epiphany continues for us through most of February. We have entered a new year with great hope and trust that the Lord is leading us on all sorts of new pathways. During this season, we will ponder things that create in us a new awareness of God's presence in our lives. We will notice in the sermons references to new ways to follow Jesus and we'll notice too that the choir brings us new music so that we can "Sing to the Lord a new song!" (Psalm 96).

The season of Epiphany also continues the season of football! As your pastor, this brings to mind those famous coaching speeches made at halftime when a really inspiring coach can send a losing team out to turn things around. Those speeches often end with rousing reminders of who we are, something along the lines of: "We are strong and we have worked hard to get to this point so go team!" I'm not sure I'm the cheerleader kind of pastor, but I do know we need to understand who we are as a parish in order to do our best work in ministry.

We are the people of Nativity. What does that mean? Who are we as a congregation? What is our strength? What have we done to get to this point in the life of this parish? How can we be a better team? How can we benefit from living into this season of Epiphany?

I invite you to ponder these questions, to dig a little deeper in your individual prayer time about who we are as a congregation and who God is calling us to be in the future. Please also ask God to help you discern your job at Epiphany. Everyone on our team has a job to do. We need more leaders. How can you get more involved? Where is God leading you to serve? Let's go out there and be a better team! Not so that we can beat our opponents, but so that we can work together more as a community of love, the love of Jesus.

Did you know that we have such abundance that no one is ever turned away? In January 51 new families visited the pantry; to include this number with the total number of families amounted to 151 families. Ninety-two families returned for a second time to the pantry. These families consisted of 155 children between the ages of 0-17; 340 adults from 18-59 and 322 were people over 60. Thank you all of you who so tirelessly attend our neighbors. Please keep our hungry community and the food pantry volunteers in your prayers.

Goals and Plan for 2023



DIOCESAN COVID VACCINE POLICY**

As the CDC defines it, up-to-date vaccines means that all participants have received the most current vaccine and booster that they are eligible to receive.
