### **Our Nativity Parish Covenant**

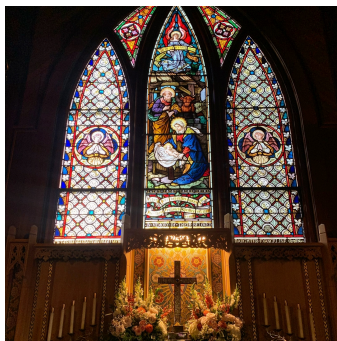
*As members of the Episcopal Church of the Nativity we covenant with God and each other to:*
