Kitchen Renovation Proposal

This proposal was drafted by Dick McMillen in consultation with the finance committee and discussed by the Vestry, who wants the congregation's input in this process. This is Nativity's kitchen.


This project isn't about luxury—it's about ministry. A functional, welcoming kitchen enables us to:

- Host more inclusive parish events
- Serve families during funerals and celebrations
- Offer meals to neighbors and community groups
- Expand outreach and rental possibilities

Financial Responsibility

Total reserves: \$1,600,000

Proposed investment: \$160,000 (Just 10% of current reserves)



Benefits to the Church

- Improves experience for parishioners and visitors
- Attracts new users and groups to the facility
- Modern, safe, sanitary equipment
- Supports growth—not stagnation
- Makes the space rentable, if desired, to support ongoing income

Proposal

- 1. Set aside up to \$160,000 for renovation
- 2. Form a project team to obtain updated plans/quotes
- 3. Begin work within the next 6–12 months

"This is a faithful act of stewardship—using our resources to support the mission and future of our church."
