Our Nativity Parish Covenant

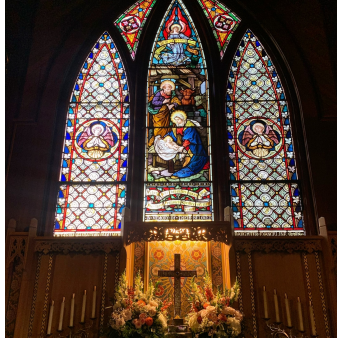
As members of the Episcopal Church of the Nativity we covenant with God and each other to:
